12 Years of Pathways to Property

Launched in 2012, the Pathways to Property programme continues to deliver on its aims to widen access to the real estate and planning profession by raising awareness of and aspirations about the vast range of careers available within the sector.

Led by the Reading Real Estate Foundation (RREF) at Henley Business School, University of Reading, the project was established as a response to the recognised lack of diversity in the industry. Through a successful outreach programme, the project exposes students from less advantaged and non-traditional backgrounds to opportunities within the property industry. In addition, the project works with teachers and career advisors to provide them with valuable information about the industry which can be passed onto their students.

The aims of the project are:

- To raise awareness of and aspirations about the diverse range of careers within the sector amongst talented students from various backgrounds, increasing the link between the industry and its future talent pool.
- To increase the diversity of applications for property related degrees and apprenticeship programmes by promoting a career in the property industry and providing students from less advantaged and non-traditional backgrounds with support into the industry through the Pathways to Property programme.



2024 marks twelve years since the Pathways to Property programme was established and it continues to deliver on its original goals.

Since the launch of Pathways to Property in 2012, the project has had a considerable impact on raising awareness of careers in property and supporting young people who aspire to enter the industry.

Impact in 2024

2024 - our twelfth year has been a year of continued expansion for Pathways to Property. We welcomed 141 students to our Summer School which is the largest number of attendees at an inperson event since Pathways began. We also held six Insight Days in Birmingham, Bristol, Cambridge, Leeds, Manchester and London, which saw an additional 116 students come through our programme. We attended 35 school events which took the form of careers fairs, virtual and in-person talks.

Summer School 2024

The twelfth Pathways to Property Summer School took place from 2–5 July 2024. 141 year 12 students joined us for four days and took part in taster lectures, a site visit, sessions offering careers advice and information about life at university as well as a group project and a careers fair.

The careers fair on the third day was attended by 17 companies and four university departments. Buoyed from a session on how to network, the students' engagement and social skills were put into practice with great affect. We subsequently ran a successful Q&A panel with some of the industry volunteers and students and it is now included as part of our Insight Day delivery.

The highlight of the week was the site visit to the Station Hill development in Reading, courtesy of Lincoln Property Company and MGT Investment Management. Students were taken on a comprehensive tour of the site after which they worked closely with our student ambassadors and industry representatives on a group project related to the site.

This activity culminated in students presenting their work to 34 members of the industry on the last day. The growth in students confidence was clear to see and the quality of their presentations was evident. Teams bonded and prizes were awarded. With numerous students asking if we could hold a fifth day and 82 % of students confirming they are considering a career in real estate, Summer School 2024 was deemed a success.

Delivery of the Summer School would not be possible without the support of academics and staff at Henley Business School, industry volunteers who engage with the students throughout the week and current Real Estate & Planning students who help to run the week and share their knowledge with the participants. We would also like to say a special thanks to Nottingham Trent University and the University of Sheffield for attending the careers fair.

Post Summer School, participants were offered the chance to take part in a one-week work experience placement in a property firm, join our e-mentoring programme and offered the opportunity to access additional sessions aimed

at supporting their progress into the industry.

We are looking forward to continuing to work with all the attendees and supporting them as they make their future career decisions.

Work experience

Seventy one students, having participated in the Summer School, or Insight Day, completed a work experience placement this year at 26 supporting firms across the country. Open Online Course (OOC)

The Pathways to Property Open Online Course (OOC) has continued to be a useful resource for students wanting to expand their knowledge of property and for those who are unable to attend the Summer School. Designed by leading academics at Henley Business School to encourage more students to consider pursuing a career in property, the course lasts three weeks and requires around six hours of study. The OOC has continued to be popular with over 30,000 learners having signed up to the course to date.

School outreach

Pathways to Property attended multiple in-person careers events and school talks throughout 2024 to engage young people in finding out more about the opportunities available within the property industry. In addition, a number of schools also invited us to deliver content online, particularly talks to groups of students. This mixed approach has worked well to enable us to make the best use of available resources. We are very grateful to the industry volunteers who gave up their time to deliver these talks and events, alongside Pathways staff and student ambassadors.



Review of 2024 project objectives

Programme integration

We have successfully set up a programme structure which brings together both participants at the Summer School, and Insight Day attendees from the same school year, into a single cohort. This ensures they receive a consistent level of support and access to the programme.

Programme evaluation

We have now established a new evaluation process. This new methodology collects evaluation data at each interaction participants have on the programme, allowing us to compare this information against a base-line taken at the first event. This will allow us to report on not just the events we deliver, but also the impact we have on individual participants. The 2024/25 cohort will be the first year group to participate in this process in full, meaning we will be able to report on it in the 2025 annual review.

Increasing numbers

We have successfully increased the size of the programme. In 2024, 257 students participated in the programme, a 60% increase on the 2023 number of participants. This was against a target increase of 30%.

Impact across the programme

With Insight Days now an established part of the Pathways to Property programme, sitting alongside the summer school, we will undertake work in 2025 to understand the impact of the different types of activity. By tracking participants in both the summer school and Insight Days, we will be able to investigate how they engage in the wider programme, and then what they go on to do after Year 13, and how this varies by the type of initial event they engage in.

Board membership

The Pathways board has seen some changes in membership in 2024.

Work will be undertaken in 2025 to understand the board as it stands, the parts of the sector it represents and where the gaps are, and recruitment activity will then be undertaken to fill these gaps. This will ensure the board is diverse, representative and can work cohesively to ensure effective direction for the Pathways programme.


Propel engagement

Host an Insight Day



Every October, our programme participants are offered the chance to take part in a one-week work experience placement. This is an invaluable opportunity providing students with not just great insight into the sector, but also experience of a corporate environment, whilst guiding and inspiring them on future career decisions. We can provide guidance on the programme for the placement week and Pathways to Property provides all students with a £250 bursary to cover associated costs.

To all colleagues, supporters and friends

As we reflect on the past year, it's incredible to see how much we've achieved together. The rapid pace of change across industries reminds us of the need to create inclusive opportunities for young people, empowering them to shape the future of real estate with fresh perspectives and diverse experiences.

2024 has been a remarkable year for Pathways to Property. We saw a 60% increase in participation compared to 2023, with 257 students engaging in our programs. Of these, 141 attended the Residential Summer School at the University of Reading, while 116 joined our Insight Days held across the country. What makes these numbers even more inspiring is the diversity of the participants: 58% were female, 88% lived in areas of deprivation (IMD quintile 1 or 2), and 67% had received free school meals. These figures reflect our commitment to reaching underrepresented communities and breaking down barriers to entry in the real estate sector.

The impact of these initiatives continues to resonate. During the October half-term, 71 students completed work experience placements, each supported by a £250 bursary. From the 2023 cohort we've been able to track, 66% have progressed to university, while 16% are now in jobs or apprenticeships. Perhaps most excitingly, 24% of the total 2023 cohort, including those we haven't been able to track, have pursued real estate-related destinations.

These achievements are more than just numbers — they represent lives changed and futures unlocked. We've been inspired to see how quickly our participants embrace the challenges and opportunities presented through our programs, offering fresh insights and tackling real-world problems with creativity and confidence. Watching them share their experiences on social media has been a particular highlight this year, as they inspire their peers and bring new voices to our industry.

None of this would have been possible without the dedication of the Pathways team, the guidance of our industry board, and the generosity of our sponsors. Your support – whether through funding, work placements, or spreading the word – has been instrumental in driving change and building opportunities for young people.

As we look ahead to 2025, we're excited to continue this journey and achieve even greater impact.
